Early Head Start

Home-Based Program

- Weekly home visits for 1 ½ hours to develop nurturing healthy attachments between parent and child. The home visitor provides child-focused visits that promote the parents' ability to support their child's development and prepares expectant mothers with skills needed before the arrival of their newborns.
- Socialization opportunities twice per month, which offer opportunities for parents and children to come together as a group for learning, discussion, and social activity.

Part-Day Program

- School year: August to May
- Monday thru Friday: 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- · Classroom hours vary by location
- · Breakfast and lunch is provided

Full-Day Program

- School year: August to July
- Monday thru Friday: 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- · Classroom hours vary by location
- · Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided

DOE Inclusion

 Inclusion is an educational philosophy that supports the rights of all children, regardless of their ability. The program combines early childhood education teaching techniques to meet school readiness outcomes for all children.

Home-Based Program

- School year: August to May
- Weekly home visits for 1 ½ hours to work collaboratively with parents on school readiness and early development activities.
- Socialization opportunities twice per month to collaborate with other homebased families.
